Key Stage One

What is Key Stage One ? (KS1)

Children in years 1 and 2 are in Key Stage One. The children are grouped into four registration classes.

Teachers in Key Stage 1 are :

Miss Cross, Mrs Wilson, Miss Taylor and Miss Martin.

What do children do?

Key Stage 1 children follow the Primary Curriculum for Maths and Literacy .



Through cross curricular topics your child will follow Primary Curriculum Science, ICT, Technology, History,

Geography, Music, Art and P.E.

R.E. , French and PHSE

(Personal, Health, Social and Emotional) are also taught.

We make regular educational visits. You will be notified about any visits at the beginning of each term.

What will my child's day be like?

The mornings tend to be mainly Literacy and Maths.

Key Stage 1 children have a daily assembly.

In the afternoons they will cover other Curriculum areas. For PE they will need blue shorts, white T. shirt and appropriate footwear.

Lessons are taught to the class and work is differentiated according to need.



Will my child have homework?

Yes your child will have weekly homework. Each night they will have a reading book to read at home. This book should be returned to school each day.

Please do comment on how your child reads in their "Reading Diary." They will also have weekly spelling homework.

Your child will usually be given one piece of Maths homework which is sometimes a game or a sheet, generally this should be returned to school.

A homework "takeaway menu" will also be available to enhance learning completed in school.



Will my child be rewarded for good behaviour?

A rewards and sanctions behaviour scheme is used. Children earn reward stickers when exceptional behaviour or learning is displayed. These are collected on their "rewards for all" card. When your child has 5 stickers they receive a Head teacher's sticker. Once the whole side is completed they are awarded a special Head Teacher's prize.

If a child misbehaves they are given a verbal warning, then their name is put on the sad face as a second warning. If they continue to misbehave



How will I find out about my child's progress?

You will be invited to Parents' Evenings during the Autumn and Spring Terms which will be a meeting between your child's class teacher and yourselves. In the Summer Term you will receive a written report.

In addition each class presents "Class Assemblies" to which you will receive a personal invitation. At these assemblies the class presents their work to the invited parents .

After the assembly parents are welcome to stay for a coffee and to visit their child's class to look at some of the work their child has been doing.

What if I need to talk to my child's teacher?

Teachers are available on the yard before and after school to answer any quick response queries.

However if you require a longer period of time please make an appointment via the office.

In the mornings registers need to be taken and

children need to begin their day in a calm, settled manner.
